Then Jesus began to denounce the towns where he had done so many miracles, because they hadn't repented of their sins and turned to God.

Matthew 11:20 –New Living Translation

Big Idea: We are responsible for the revelation that we receive, and the proper response to Jesus' revelation is repentance.

Have you ever been held responsible for something that you didn't even realize was your responsibility? If so how did that make you feel?

Why in this passage does Jesus hold the people of this cities of Korazin, Bethsaida, and Capernaum more responsible than the other cities mentioned in the passage?

What is it that Jesus expected them to do in response to the miracles they had witnessed and why do you think this was the expected response?

This week we talked about the revelation that God has given to each of us. The people in these cities had the opportunity to see Jesus walk on the earth and do miracles. **What kind of revelation has God given to us about himself today? What do you think God might expect us to do with that information?**
